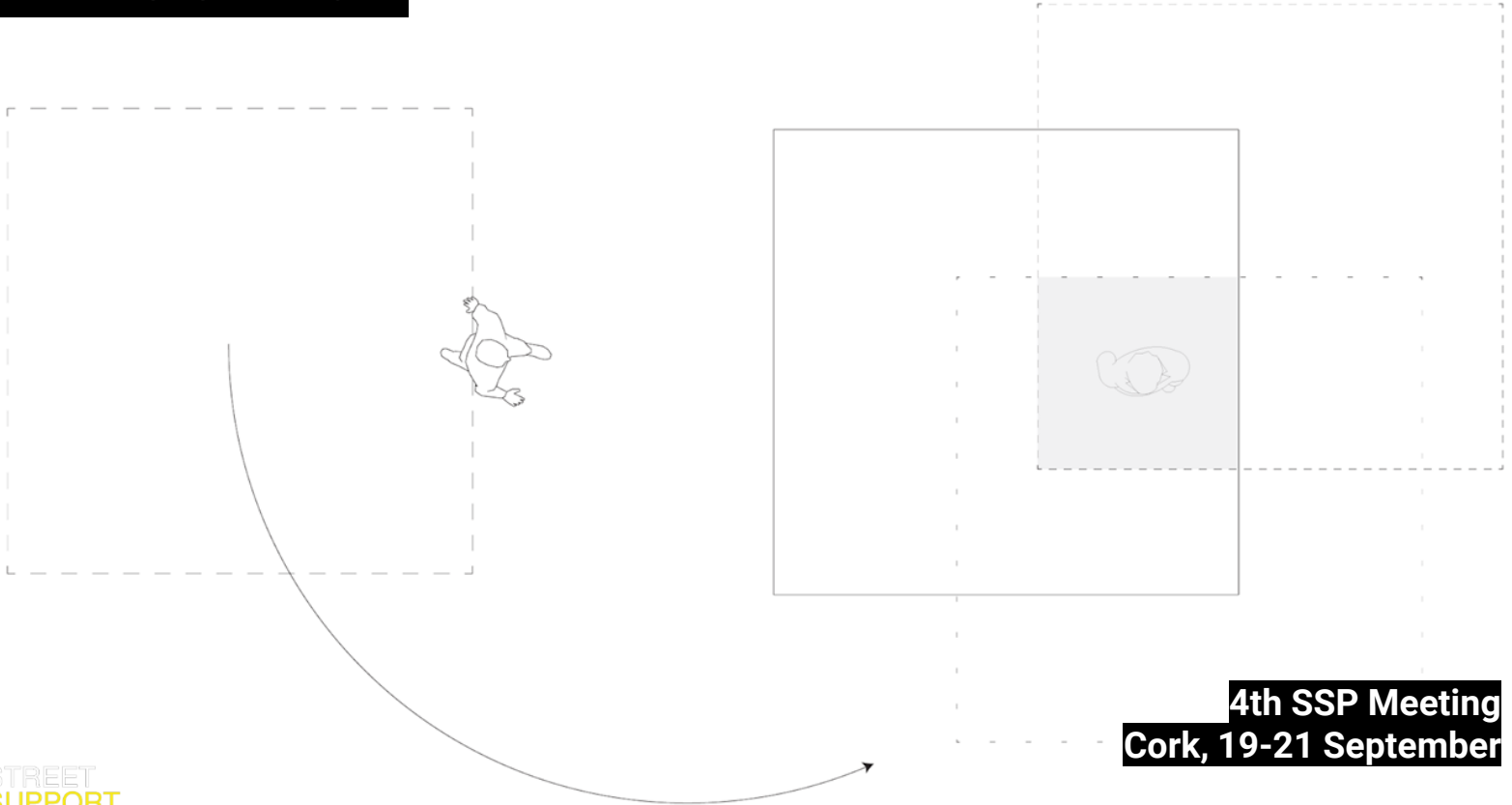

01_GOALS OF THE TOOLBOX

GENERAL GOAL

To provide with tools and guidance to develop and implement inclusive adult learning and work integration opportunities which, at the same time, contribute to the reduction of alcohol and drug related nuisance in public space.

HOWEVER

- There is not a clear definition of what “inclusive intervention” means.
- There is a need to understand what barriers contribute to further exclusion.
- There is a need to support specific answers to contextually bounded questions.
